

NWNNA GENERAL MEETING MINUTES, MAY 25, 2017

The meeting was called to order at 6:35 pm at the NW Rec Center on 11th St. NW. Minutes of the April meeting were read and approved.

Finances: \$199,104.05 balance in account. \$1,000 grant from the Knox Family Fund has been donated toward the "Rockin' Reunion".

Lt. McGarvey, District Lt.: There has been a lot of burglaries in the NewBo area. Police caught a suspect at 3:30 am with a bunch of crowbars and a lock-pick kit.

Curfew for age 15 and under: must be off the streets by 11:00 pm and until 5:00 am.

Marty Haeger: Redevelopment on K Ave. & Ellis Blvd. to have new store front and new roof. It will be occupied by a first-time business owner. Plans to put in Breakfast diner that will be open from 6 am to 2 pm. The White Building is storage for props, sets, Theatre Cedar Rapids.

Roots housing development is finished. There is talk about starting a "Roots 2" program.

Jim Happel: Developing "Ellis Landing" condos and 16-foot high flood wall on property across from Ellis Park. Will have 27 units, parking garage, security entrance, storage. Six units to have decks above the garages. Atrium to have live trees 10' tall, fish pond and waterfall. Four penthouses will have spiral staircases.

Annette, Safe CR: 182 nuisance properties. 30 NW properties are in compliance.

Kevin: 1124 6th St. NW paperwork filed for demolition. Need order from judge to board up. Meeting with owner of 10th Street and J Avenue to force progress.

Time Check park is deemed unsafe due to exposed metal on slides that could cause injury.

Steve Hershner: Geophysical survey. Privately owned property with grass 12" or longer should be reported to 285-5897.

Jim Hauser: Public Health Building \$25 million. Controlled substances fines will be charged to adult if child or youth is caught using on their property. (Civil: \$750 - \$1,000).

Bids are being accepted for demolition of Cooper's Mill and Hubbard Building.

City Council will be adapting fire works ordinances. Fire Chief making 2 recommendations.

Extending Ellis Blvd. To 6th Street may take 2 years (must acquire Mid-American property).


Paving for Progress: O Avenue project will take 3 years.
